Post-Election Balance of Power

Immediate Issues

- RELIEF PACKAGE WITH AID TO STATES AND INSTITUTIONS
- Student visas and H1-B visas
- FAFSA Simplification
- Diversity training/critical race theory executive order
- Budget expiring on December 11th



Outlook on the 117th Congress

- If the Senate is controlled by the GOP, it is likely to be gridlock between the Democratic House, GOP Senate, and Biden White House
- Areas of possible bipartisan support are community colleges, workforce
- President Biden will likely use regulatory powers to the extent possible to further his agenda, including in higher education. Trump-era executive actions and regulations will likely be replaced
- Biden's ambitious higher education platform and HEA reauthorization is unlikely to be considered in GOPcontrolled Senate
- Control of the Senate HELP Committee remains unknown at this time, but Sen. Richard Burr (R-NC) is frontrunner



Reversal of Trump-era Executive Actions

- DACA restoration
- Diversity/Critical Race Theory Executive Order
- Section 117 implementation
- Title IX
- Gainful employment rule
- Borrower defense
- H1 visas
- Lawsuits/investigations against universities
- International students attending college online



Debt-Free Community College



- No tuition for up to two years of community college, including training programs with good track records
- First-dollar program
- Encourage collaboration with community orgs, wraparound services and emergency grants
- Part-timers, adults, and DREAMers included
- Students are welcome to transfer to a 4-year college afterwards
- The federal gov't pay 75%, states do the rest



Invest in Community College Capacity and Success



- Provide grants to community colleges to help with retention and completion and scale successes
- Invest in reforms, including dual enrollment, transfer, faculty professional development, remediation.
- Invest \$8 billion in community college facilities and technology



Invest in Workforce Training Programs



- Invest \$50 billion in high-quality training programs
- Support partnerships between universities and industries
- Boost number of apprenticeships and partnerships with unions



4-Year College Affordability



- Tuition-Free Public Colleges (below \$125K)
- Double the maximum Pell Grant
- Ensure DREAMers are eligible for financial aid
- Restore Pell for the incarcerated



University Capacity and Transfer (4-Year Colleges)



- Create a "Title I" program for under-resourced fouryear universities
- Investments in wraparound services and emergency funding for students
- Grants for states for accelerating educational attainment
- Prioritize work-study for job-related and public service roles
- Crack down on predatory colleges



Student Debt Repayment



- For those beyond \$25K, pay 5% of for 20 years, everything else forgiven
- Opt-out of income-based repayment, not opt-in
- No taxes on debt forgiveness
- Forgive \$10k in student debt due to the pandemic.
- \$10k of student debt relief for public service, up to \$50k. Incomebased repayment for 5 more years, then total forgiveness. Automatic opt-in for those in public service, those with prior service will qualify
- Fix the current PSLF program Source: Biden Campaign
- Bring back borrower defense rule





HBCUs/TCUs/MSIs



- Make sure that MSIs, including private HBCUs, are not undermined by the tuition-free public university plan
- Invest in centers for excellence in research and connect students at these institutions to learning and career opportunities
- Invest in high-tech labs and facilities at HBCUs/TCUs/MSIs
- Invest in increasing enrollment/retention/completion/employment

- Invest in Title III and Title V of the HEA
- Reduce funding disparities for these institutions



Others



- Permit bankruptcy for private student loans
- Protect the GI Bill
- Access to aid for undocumented/international students in the CARES Act
