



Equity & Student Success

Deficit Cognitive Frame

- Students are blamed
- Efforts to "fix" students
- Inequality is attributed to cultural stereotypes, lack of motivation or initiative
- Inequality is rationalized,
 beyond our control



Equity Cognitive Frame

- Institutional responsibility
- Inequality is attributed to cumulative structural effects of placing underserved groups at a disadvantage
- Inequality is viewed as solvable

Campus Basic Needs Insecurity

In 2019, 167,000 students from 171 two-year and 56 four - year institutions responded to the #RealCollege survey

- 39% were food insecure in last 30 days
- 46% were housing insecure in last year
- 17% were homeless in the last year

Pandemic Impacts on Students

44% Bought computers to continue studies 66% significant cost, 77% Black students

37% Re-enrolling is challenging, 45% Latinx


Understanding Student Impact

Open Educational Resources

"Automated Billing:Inclusive Access"

Free online and low-cost print options	Free online until add/drop date when opt-out of purchase is required
Can retain access to materials indefinitely	After payment, materials available until class ends. Pay again to retake class.
Faculty chooses OER and notifies campus stakeholders & students	Campus stakeholders coordinate CONTRACT regarding publisher digital materials
No student account or data required.	Student data is required for setup. Institutions must ensure student privacy





OER Institutional Benefits

- Enrollment and tuition benefits
 - Community college students taking multiple OER courses earned more credits, similar grades to student in traditional courses.
 - High engagement reported
- Positive teaching impacts
 - Instructors reported that OER affected the way they presented and used materials in class, increased the relevance of those materials
- Recouping development costs
 - estimates suggest a modest 3 percent institutional ROI after the initial
 OER course development period and enrollment increases.








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Open Education Sustainability


